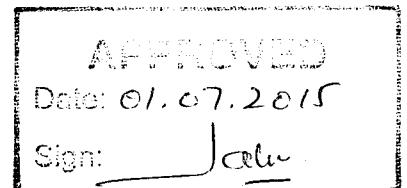
TRAINING OBJECTIVES
